Connecting with God is one of the most important aspects of our relationship with God; however, it is also one of the hardest on which to stay focused and disciplined. There are many ways of deepening our relationship with God. Come learn some simple ways of creating space for God's grace as you nurture the process of inner-transformation. These teaching/worship sessions are designed to inform, engage, and inspire what some of the great mystics and spiritual writers call contemplation. Each session stands alone. Come as you are able and drawn. Consider bringing a friend.

After a summer break, we will return to our monthly sessions in the Room A-203 on Sunday, September 18 at 9:30 a.m. Our next exploration will be *Creating a Rule of Life*. The purpose of a Rule of Life is to help us as individuals engage with intentionality and consistency the spiritual practices that lead us deeper into the heart of God and allow God to do his work in us. Ruth Haley Barton, in her book *Sacred Rhythms: Arranging Our Lives for Spiritual Transformation*, says that a rule of life is "the structure that enables us to say yes to the process of transformation day in and day out" and that it seeks to address the question: How do I want to live so I can be who I want to be?

September Disaster Response Rebuilding Trip Postponed

Our scheduled building team trip to Canton/Cruso NC on September 11 has been postponed until Spring for two reasons. Firstly, we didn't have enough folks sign up to make a viable team. We will postpone our trip until Spring and publish the dates available well in advance, allowing everyone to schedule it on their calendars. Secondly, our tool trailer which we had stored in a seemingly well-secured spot was broken into and ransacked by thieves. We lost many of our most-used tools, including our generator, two miter chop saws, two skill saws, two air compressors and all our extension cords. The storage location (Triad Healthcare Preparedness Coalition, formerly, State Medical Assistance Team) was surrounded by a 10-ft chain link fence with barbed wire and had 24-hour camera surveillance. They were able to circumvent all security and cut locks off all doors. TriadHPC allowed us to park there without charge. The trailer was not damaged. Please direct any questions to me.
