#### 1. Be A VBS Volunteer

We are looking for volunteers to help make our VBS happen. Would you like to lead a crew of campers or a rotation station? Would you want to help with check in and check out each day? Would you be interested in helping with one of our preschool classes or in our nursery? If you answered yes to any of these questions, then this is the perfect opportunity. VBS will be open to children in rising Kindergarten–rising 5<sup>th</sup> Grade. If you are a volunteer with children younger than rising Kindergarten, we will have a preschool class and a nursery available from 8 a.m.–1 p.m. each day. If your children are rising 6<sup>th</sup> graders or above, they can volunteer as well. If interested, please register online (link). #### 2. Volunteer As A Summer Sunday School Helper

During the months of July and August we are in need of Sunday School Helpers who are willing to provide care to our CUMC Kids. We have openings in the nursery, the preschool Sunday School class, or teaching the elementary school students a lesson each week. We have openings at all three services. If you are willing to sign up to help for one hour during one of the services in July or August in any of these program areas, please let Pastor Sara know. All materials and lessons will be provided for you. This is a fabulous opportunity to engage with the children of our church without committing to an entire year of teaching. #### 3. Join The Special Event Childcare Team

For many years the Children's Ministry has had a Special Events Childcare Team. This team is made up of a large group of people who are vetted and background checked and could be called upon to help out (if available) with childcare for special events at the church. Some of these events in the past have included one of our support groups, special classes or Bible studies that the church offers, or any other event outside of Sunday morning that has a need for childcare. Since COVID, our Special Events Childcare Team has dwindled, so I am now in the recruitment process to help grow our team back. What does being on the Special Events Childcare Team look like you ask?

- If you would like to be a part of the team, you will be put on the contact list.
- If a childcare need for an event comes up Pastor Sara will reach out to you to tell you the commitment (day/time/how many weeks) to see if you would be interested in helping.
- If you are available, great! If not, Pastor Sara will reach out to others.
- Most childcare requests come from our evening support groups that meet for 1-1/2 to 2 hours.
- Children can range in age from birth to 5<sup>th</sup> grade.
- This is a paid opportunity. Our special event childcare team members are paid \$12 an hour.
