

Contemplative Ways of Opening to the Holy



Inside we encounter the wise and the foolish, and instructions for the journey to find the wisdom that comes from God alone. *Proverbs: Pathways to Wisdom,* by Dominick Samuel Hernández, explores the context, language, and interpretation of the book of Proverbs. Each chapter covers well-known verses and examines prevalent themes throughout the book. From the fear of the Lord to the Woman of Valor in Proverbs 31, Hernández explores an array of verses and reveals literary and historical details that supply profound insight into familiar passages.
