

Dec. 11th Christmas Cantata: Magnificat by Taylor Scott Davis 11:00 am Traditional Service Featuring CUMC Adult and Children's Choirs, Soloists, and Orchestra

The Magnificat, Latin for "magnifies," is one of the earliest songs known to Christendom. The text of the canticle is taken from Luke 1:46-55. Luke relays the story of the expectant Mary's visit to her cousin Elizabeth, who is pregnant with John the Baptist. When Mary greets her cousin, Elizabeth's son jumps in her womb—a sign of John's future act of proclaiming the adult Jesus "the lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world."

Moreover, Elizabeth praises Mary for her faith, and Mary responds in song with what is now known as the Magnificat.

This year's cantata is a majestic setting of Mary's response to Elizabeth: "My soul magnifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior. For He has looked with favor on the lowliness of His servant...." Taylor Scott Davis composes a stirring setting of Mary's song, with stunning melodic lines and lush harmonies supported by full orchestration. Make no mistake, this cantata isn't really about Mary. It's about Mary's faith and God's work in and through her because of that faith. Mary's song repeatedly points us to a God of power and mercy, who promised to set the world right through Christ. Indeed, God fulfills His promises to Abraham and Israel. We can marvel that He chooses an ordinary young woman whose faith—and offspring—will change the world.



A 5-week study of the book by Adam Hamilton Thursdays, January 12–February 12 from 4:30–6 p.m. via Zoom



Join this book study where Adam Hamilton explores popular sayings that miss the point. They are simple phrases: "God helps those who help themselves," "Love the sinner, hate the sin," and others. They sound Christian – like something you might find in the Bible. We've all heard these words. Maybe we've said them. They capture some element of truth, yet they miss the point in important ways. Discover the whole truth by comparing common Christian clichés with the wisdom found in Scripture.

The Chapters in *Half Truths: God Helps Those Who Themselves and Other Things the Bible Doesn't Say:* 1. Everything Happens for a Reason; 2. God Helps Those Who Help Themselves; 3. God Won't Give You More Than You Can Handle; 4. God Said It, I Believe It, That Settles It; 5. Love the Sinner, Hate the Sin.
