2023 Mission Outreach Support Team Committee Yearly Report

In 2023, we were able to grant \$41,600 to the following agency partners in our community.

- **Clemmons Food Pantry:** This year, we were able to grant **\$13,700.** Four thousand came from the MOST Special Fund and the remaining \$9,700 came from the Miscellaneous Missions line item in the Operating Budget. www.clemmonsfoodpantry.org
- Deeper Journey Ministries: A new non-profit came to us this year asking for funds in support of their spiritual formation ministry, the Sacred Invitation. We voted to grant them \$2,000 from the Miscellaneous Missions line item in the Operating Budget. www.thelydiagroup.com
- Jerry Long YMCA Bright Beginnings: Of the \$2,500 requested, we gave the full amount. Funds came from the MOST Special Fund.
- **SPARK:** This year was our first one supporting this local non-profit with an agency grant. Our church has partnered with SPARK for item collections and activities. We were able to grant **\$2,000** in support of their afterschool program at Peace Haven Estates. Funds came out of the Miscellaneous Missions line item in the Operating Budget. www.spark-community.org
- Watchmen of the Streets: We continue to support this homeless ministry through item collection, volunteers and funds. This year MOST granted a total of **\$21,400** with payments throughout the year. Five thousand came from the MOST Special Fund and the remaining \$16,400 came from the Miscellaneous Missions line item in the Operating Budget. www.watchmenofthestreets.com

We were able to grant \$9,500 to our foreign mission/building teams.

- Guatemala Building and Mission Team: Of the \$7,000 requested for building supplies, we were able to grant the full amount. Funds came from the MOST Special Fund. *Note: The team had to postpone their October trip until January 2024.* Bart and Cheryl Shaw, lornik@aol.com
- Jamaica Building Team: Of the \$2,500 requested for building supplies, we were able to grant the full amount. Funds came from the MOST Special Fund. Tom Miller, tlmiller4160@gmail.com

MOST was also able to provide scholarships totaling \$7,836.

- **Guatemala Building and Mission Team:** Two team members requested and received scholarships of \$1,800 each. The **\$3,600** came out of the MOST Special Fund.
- Jamaica Building Team: One team member requested and received a scholarship of \$1,600. The funds came out of the Miscellaneous Missions line item in the Operating Budget.
- **Zoe Interest Mission Trip:** One team member requested and was approved for a **\$2,636** scholarship. Funds came from the MOST Special Fund.

MOST approved the following fundraisers:

- Guatemala Building and Mission Team Shred Event held on May 6.
- Children's Ministry Special Fund "Stuff the Children's Fund" Envelope Fundraiser held on May 7.
- CCC: Honduras Mission Trip Pumpkin Patch held from September 30-October 31.
- Children's Ministry and Clemmons United Methodist Preschool and Kindergarten Truck or Treat Fall Festival held on October 25.

Through the generosity of our church family and our community, Clemmons UMC was able to support the above missions and ministries through grants and scholarships totaling \$58,936 (\$26,000 from the Miscellaneous Missions line item in the Operating Budget and \$32,936 from the MOST Special Fund).

Jamaica Chili Lunch Fundraiser on Sunday, January 21




