Thursday Afternoon Lenten Book Study The Grace of Les Misérables by Matt Rawle February 23–March 30 @ 4:30–6 p.m. via Zoom

In the six-week study *The Grace of Les Misérables*, author and pastor Matt Rawle dives into six ideals found in the story—grace, justice, poverty, revolution, love, and hope—each represented by a character in Hugo's story. As these imperfect and relatable characters interact, we can see how these ideals work together (perhaps even in spite of each other) out in the world. This study brings us to the intersection of Church and Pop Culture by drawing parallels between the iconic story and musical and our Christian calling, inspiring us to both understand our faith and live it out in the world. *The Grace of Les Misérables* is available in most online bookstores (Amazon <u>link</u>).
